The Highland Center for the Arts is physically accessible for visitors who use wheelchairs or other mobility aids, and those who prefer not to use stairs.



All visitors are welcome to enter through the level, paved sidewalk at the main entrance to the facility.



Accessible restrooms are available for all in the main lobby.



Assistive listening devices will be available free of charge.



American Sign Language (ASL) will be provided if requested by October 10.



Programs provided in braille if requested by October 10.



Large print programs will be available.



Service animals are welcome.

The Highland Center for the Arts is located off a rural dirt road with parking available in a loose gravel parking lot in front of the main entrance.
