

Preview Letter of Intent for FY2017 Animating Infrastructure Grants

6. List members of your project team as well as partners. Indicate if they are potential or committed. (Team members are directly responsible for implementing the project. Partners are community advisors, supporters, sponsors etc. of your project but are not directly responsible for implementing the project.)
7. Indicate if you have engaged an artist(s) for this project already. If yes, include the artist(s) name(s) and website(s), if any, and talk about their role. If no, will you need guidance from the Council or another agency in identifying a suitable artist?
8. Address the following questions in 6,000 characters or less:
 - A. Briefly describe the project in which you would like to integrate public art.
 - B. What is your vision and long-term goal for this project?
 - C. Describe the planning to date including the timeline and the qualifications of the leadership involved.
 - D. Describe unique attributes or history about your community that might be reflected in the artistic process or product.
 - E. Why is this project important to your community at this time?

Applicants may propose more than one project idea. Address the questions above for each project idea.

Media: Include up to four images for each project idea submitted. Images should be of the community, potential project location(s), and any other visuals that might help to identify project potential for artist involvement. If submitting images for more than one project idea, be sure to label the images so that they can be attributed to the appropriate proposal (e.g., Project Two: potential site).
